Hello Everyone,

I wonder what a full life means to you?

At the moment it feels as if life is very restricted. We can't go to places we usually go to and do the things we usually do. Perhaps we can't be with the people we really want to be with. Maybe you're having days when it feels like the walls are closing in and there's only so much Netflix you can watch. Life feels reduced and constrained and anything but full.

There is research to show that when a community faces a tough time, there is an initial period of heroic effort where everyone pulls together and enthusiastically focusses on what needs to be done. There is also a well-recognised phase, where it becomes harder to sustain that initial level of effort and enthusiasm wanes and energy flags. That's natural and it's OK if you feel a bit like that.

So perhaps, some six weeks into lockdown, now is a good time to remind ourselves that fullness of life is something that Jesus offers us and it's a fullness which has nothing to do with whether we are cooped up indoors or not, or whether we can mix with all our friends and family or not. It's not even about whether we are superhumanly shopping for our neighbours, whilst home-schooling the kids *and* at the same time managing to work from home.

Jesus' fullness of life is about an unshakeable peace, despite the constant barrage of bad news; it's a deep-down, quiet sense of joy, despite the sadness around us; it's about a stronger love in our hearts for one another, even when others are driving us crazy; it's about having a certain hope that all things will work for good through Him.

As we take time to listen for his voice, may He lead us into that place of fullness, even in lockdown.


