O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the world" (Psalm 8:1)

The Old Testament Reading for today is that wonderful Psalm, Psalm 8.

When we come to think about God, we know Him because of our personal relationship with Him, but one difficulty is that, in a way, we don't know Him because we can't imagine Him. This is a Psalm that helps us with this dilemma. Here, what the Psalmist does to get over the problem of not being able to describe God, is to describe what He is like through the evidence of His presence in the world. He is described by the Psalmist as a majestic (what a wonderful word) God, the evidence of which is seen around us in His creation and how His creation is ordered. For example, look at the heavens, the moon and the stars which God has put in place, so much of which is far beyond our imagining. Today, with the advent of more and more advances in astronomy. we are discovering objects in outer space that could never have been dreamed of in the Psalmist's day. Then, closer to home, we see the amazing creation of ourselves. We are told that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139). Moreover, we have been made in God's likeness and have been given the privilege and ability of sharing in the care of His creatures" (Genesis 1:26). Through these things we have insight (just a little) into knowing what God is like. Today, we have a great advantage over the Psalmist because we can know God through His Son, Jesus. The Bible tells us that "Jesus is the image of the invisible God. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross". So, we may not be able to imagine God, but we can know Him and have a real, side by side, relationship with Him through His Son, Jesus.
