All Saints

Do you know any saints? I clearly remember a Christian friend telling me: "I have no idea what the Apostles' creed means when it talks about believing in the communion of saints. I thought they all died long ago, and they really don't mean much to me now." Well, that was a challenge to answer. My first response was that I was completely confident that there were plenty of saints alive today, just as there always had been and just as there always will be. They may not be easy to recognise and probably none of them think of themselves as saints. However, their actions - of love, care, compassion, kindness and so on – performed with humility, without self-interest and faith-inspired reveal inner qualities we recognise as saintly. Throughout my life, I have always had the privilege to know and relate to people whom I regard as saintly - these are the people I turn to directly or in prayer to guide me when I am not sure about the right way to go.

Our gospel reading, Matthew's account of the beatitudes takes us to the heart of Jesus' teaching about His Kingdom and the attitudes and behaviours we need to adopt to take part. They are not easy: again and again, Jesus seems to be saying the opposite of what we expect. The inhabitants in His Kingdom are poor in spirit, mourning, meek, hungry for righteousness, merciful, peace-making, persecuted and reviled but thank goodness, they are also blessed. Jesus lived out and showed us the right way: not world-centred or selfcentred but God-centred. It's all summed up in his two commandments - love God and love our neighbours. Fortunately, there are lots of people who have chosen the Jesus way, a great cloud of witnesses. When we let Jesus into our lives, we join that cloud and can draw strength from all the others in it. In that cloud are people we respect and honour, cherish and nurture. They can inspire us as we can inspire them. This what I think when I say: "I believe in the communion of saints."
