## Thomas the Twin

**'Thomas, called the Twin, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.'** John 20:24

In addition to the major Christian festivals that we celebrate each year, Christmas & Easter for example, the church also celebrates Saints days for notable biblical characters. This coming Sunday is the Festival of St Thomas the Apostle, who is perhaps better known to us as – 'Doubting Thomas'.

Now I wonder how many of you know the Bible tells us that Thomas was called the 'Twin', with some Bible translations using the word '*Didymus*', which also means twin.

In John 20:24 we read: '*Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.*' This passage then proceeds to tell us how Thomas comes to be given his 'Doubting' nickname.

So, having noted the words '*Thomas, called the Twin*' do you know who the other twin is? It is - *You! Me! All of us!* Whoever you are, reading this page today, you are Thomas' twin. Think about it: how often have you doubted God's love, His goodness, His grace, His faithfulness, and His promises?

What's the solution? An up-close-and-personal encounter with Jesus like Thomas had.

But while the Bible tells us little about him, Thomas' cautious approach to believing in the resurrection laid the foundation for evidence-based faith and for the Protestant teaching of sola fide, or faith alone. And even though he lived 2,000 years ago, Thomas also serves as a foil for Christians today—those who have not seen and yet have believed.

It happens when you read His Word and a verse leaps off the page, causing you to exclaim, '*My Lord and my God!*' It happens in conversation with a friend when he or she shares such wisdom and insight that you find yourself saying, '*My Lord and my God!*' It happens when you pray like the psalmist: '*Be good to Your servant, that I may live and obey Your word. Open my eyes to see the wonderful truths in Your instructions.*' (Psalm 119:17–18)
