No longer a slave, but a brother

One could hardly call Philemon a book; it's the fourth shortest in the Bible at just 25 verses. And yet the letter is rich with gospel echoes.


At its heart, Philemon is about reconciliation. Paul appeals to Philemon to forgive and welcome back Onesimus, a runaway slave who has now become a Christian and Paul pleads with Philemon to receive Onesimus "no longer as a slave, but more than a slave—as a beloved brother" (v. 16).

In this relationship we see a microcosm of our own human story; a mirroring of the gospel itself: humanity, once estranged from God, is reconciled to Him through Christ and even though we are sinners, God welcomes us back, not as slaves but as family, as his children. This radical redefinition of our identity in Christ echoes Paul's declaration in Galatians 3:28, that now there is neither slave nor free... for you are all one in Christ. In Paul's willingness to intercede for Onesimus and even to take on his debt (v. 18), we see another gospel parallel. Here, Paul plays the role of a mediator, much like Jesus, who took our debt upon Himself on the cross so that we might be reconciled to the Father.

The tone of Paul's letter reflects gospel grace. He does not command Philemon to take back his runaway slave, though he could. Instead, he appeals "for love's sake" (v. 9), modelling the way grace invites rather than compels.

Ultimately, Philemon gives us a real life example of how the gospel transformed hearts, relationships and communities in quite radical ways—not by force, but by love, forgiveness, and a new identity in Christ. That is still the challenge it poses for us today: do we believe people can change; how far are we willing to forgive; will we let Christ heal, transform and restore our relationships? I hope the answer is yes, especially when, like Philemon, we realise how much we ourselves have been forgiven, changed and welcomed back into God's love.
