
When you think about it, John the Baptist was guite a remarkable man. He was the one chosen by God to prepare the way for the coming of Jesus. He was quite unique and something of a loner. As he grew up he lived in the desert, living on locusts and wild honey, and he was dressed in clothes made of camel hair, with a leather belt around his waist. You might well think: "a strange man indeed and, from his appearance, perhaps a frightening man?" He was a messenger sent from God ,but his message was not a particularly attractive one: "Preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" he did not hold back in what he had to say. To the people who came to him he addressed them as: "You brood of vipers!" He told them to put things right - the "haves" should share with the "have-nots"; the tax collectors should not defraud the people; the soldiers were condemned for their unethical practices. In all, you might think he was an unattractive man and one to be avoided. Yet we are told that crowds went out to him from Jerusalem, and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Really quite astonishing! We might well ask why this should be, but the answer is there "The Lord's hand was with him", he was doing what God had called him to do: "Preparing the way for the Lord", so the people came confessing their sins and seeking repentance. God was preparing them for the coming of a Saviour.

Just as John the Baptist was called by God to prepare the people for the coming of Jesus into the world, so we are called to prepare people for the second coming of Jesus, when we all must come before the judgement throne of God. To tell people that we have all sinned and fall short of God's standards may be unpopular, and to tell people we have to repent of our sins and seek forgiveness, through the death of Jesus on the cross, may not be easy, but may we have that same courage as John the Baptist. Let us remember that this is God's work to which we are called, and His saving power is able to soften hard hearts and prepare them to enter His Kingdom.
