Practice what we preach

Both these passages offer a rich reflection on Christian identity and the call to live out the gospel.

In Colossians, Paul opens with thanksgiving for the Colossian believers, commending their faith, love, and hope. He emphasizes the transformative power of the gospel, which bears fruit in those who understand God's grace. Paul prays that they will be filled with spiritual wisdom, so they may live lives worthy of the Lord, marked by endurance, joy, and thankfulness for being rescued from darkness and transferred into Christ's kingdom.

This spiritual foundation connects powerfully with Luke 10:25–37, the well-known Parable of the Good Samaritan. In response to the question, "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus redefines neighbourliness as compassion in action, going beyond religious boundaries, social expectations, or comfort zones. The Samaritan shows mercy where others pass by embodying love that costs something and involves risk.

Together, these passages challenge us not only to receive the gospel with understanding and gratitude but also to let it shape our way of being in the world. Paul's vision of a life "pleasing to the Lord" takes concrete form in the Samaritan's mercy. To walk "worthy of the Lord" (Col. 1:10) is to see the wounded by the road and not turn away. The Christian life is thus both deeply rooted in divine grace and radically outward in love. These texts remind us that true discipleship marries faith and compassion, knowledge and action, prayer and practice. LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOUR - even if they don't...
