
We are probably far more familiar with Matthew's version of the Beatitudes (Matthew 5.3-12) than we are with the version that we find in Luke's gospel. Luke's list is shorter and pithier – more focussed on physical, practical realities, than perhaps the lofty moral ideals or spirituality Matthew describes. Luke speaks of physical poverty and hunger, rather than just being poor in spirit or having a hunger for righteousness, for example. He speaks of actually weeping and not just 'mourning'.

But perhaps the biggest difference between the two gospels is in how Luke's blessings are followed by a corresponding list of 'woes'. In Luke there is a sense, not just of blessing, provision and comfort for those who are suffering, but also of judgment for those who sit by, enjoying their plenty and their good fortune, while others are in want or despair. One day, says Jesus, the tables will be turned. Being callous or insensitive to the woes of others, will eventually bring woe on us.

However, the strangest of these woes is the last one: 'woe to you when everyone speaks well of you'. We can see why Jesus would want to highlight the plight of the poor, hungry and grieving and provide them with hope; but why is it wrong if others speak well of us? Luke's contrast here is between those whose very 'name' has been 'rejected as evil' – in other words their very existence has been rejected – and those who crave recognition and admiration and bask in the approval of others. Jesus warns them how quickly the fickle court of public opinion can change.

But, when Jesus calls it a woe to be honoured and recognised and a blessing to be hated and despised, it is not just a paradox, it is a bare-faced challenge to the prevailing worldview of the time, that the rich and comfortable must have deserved God's favour, while the poor, the downtrodden and dispossessed had earned his displeasure. Jesus turns that thinking on its head in no uncertain terms. Somehow, that still feels like a challenge we need to heed today.
