The Christian safeguarding charity, Thirtyone:eight, run an annual campaign — Safeguarding Sunday — to raise awareness about the whole area of safeguarding in churches and other organisations. This Sunday — 17^{th} November — is Safeguarding Sunday. And yes — I'm acutely aware of the painful irony that this coincides with the first Sunday after the Archbishop of Canterbury has resigned in relation to the historic handling of a particular safeguarding case; taking 'personal and institutional responsibility' for the 'safeguarding failures of the Church of England'.

The past couple of decades have seen several organisations and institutions called to account for how they've handled (or not) cases of abuse perpetrated by those in positions of power and influence. That the Church (of various denominations and traditions) is one of those institutions should grieve us deeply. The fellowship of Christ's followers should be a safe haven and refuge for everyone; otherwise, how can we point people towards a loving, compassionate God?

In one sense, it's good that institutional and societal cultures, which in the past were perhaps too deferential to those in certain positions, are now being made to hear the voices of those who, for so many years, had no voice. That's where Thirtyone:Eight get their name (Proverbs 31.8). And it's good that light is being shone into the dark corners – but it is a slow, painful and emotionally costly process, for all concerned, but especially for the ones who have been abused and so, first and foremost, we pray for them. This week's reading from Hebrews speaks about sin and forgiveness and- praise God - that in Christ Jesus there is forgiveness for those who repent and are genuinely remorseful and contrite. But we shouldn't confuse being forgiven by God with the need to face human justice and accountability.

Archbishop Welby has taken responsibility for safeguarding failures within the Church of England and he is to be commended for that and we pray that he would know the Lord's assurance and strength, to endure the ongoing repercussions. However, safeguarding is rarely, if ever, just the responsibility of one person. Others will have had opportunity to act along the way. Safeguarding works when we understand we all have a part to play and we are all accountable.



Here at St Mary's we have an amazing and diligent Safeguarding Officer in Barbara Bashford, but she can't do it on her own. We are all called to be watchful, but not fearful; diligent, but not paranoid. And maybe this is a moment for some collective repentence. How many of us have rolled our eyes when asked to renew our DBS certificates or sighed with exasperation when having to do another safeguarding course?!

Together we are the Church, the Body of Christ – together we should form that place of hope and new life for everyone – so let us consider how we can spur one another on in this task of ensuring everyone is safe and to be that place of transformation for all.
