


19th January 2025



In today's Gospel reading, many are captivated by the sheer quantity of wine involved—potentially as much as 800 standard bottles. Wow! What a party! Our human eves are often drawn to quantity. It fuels our ambitions and desires—the big salary, the big house. How often do we arrive at the airport, hoping the check-in clerk will say, "You've been chosen for an upgrade"? The big seat, extra legroom—happy days! But does it actually happen in real life?

On the surface, this miracle can seem like it's all about changing a huge quantity of water into wine. And, of course, that is there. When God gives, He gives generously. This is what captures many people's imaginations and influences the prayers of some Christians. Please give us more, more, more of whatever we want.

However, it's worth noticing the words spoken by the master of the banquet to the bridegroom: "You have saved the best till now." It's the quality of the wine that's commented on, not the quantity. This is worth reflecting on. Many of us hold dear the promise that "the gift of God is eternal life." We often interpret this as meaning "everlasting" life, focusing on the quantity of time. But another dimension is the quality of that life—it's simply the best. Jesus doesn't just promise us a good life, but the best life. He can do this because, on the cross, he paid the price for sin. With Jesus, we can know the best life, holding both quantity and quality. May we show it in our lives and share it with those who don't yet know the Best Life with Jesus.
