A pupil asked me today how old I was.

Not something I was about to divulge, of course! But the question made me pause and reflect on just how much the world has changed since my own childhood. Things that were once commonplace would now seem completely foreign to today's generation.

I wonder—do you remember a time before freezers? If so, you may also recall the old method of preserving homegrown vegetables. In our house, large stone jars



were carefully washed and set aside for storing produce through the winter. My father loved growing vegetables, especially runner beans, which always gave us a


bumper crop. When harvest time came, my mother would dedicate hours—usually at the weekend—to preparing them. As children, we were expected to help: washing the jars, slicing and blanching the beans, plunging them into an ice bath, drying them, and finally layering them in jars with salt.

Even now, I remember exactly how to do it! Salt was an essential preservative, keeping food fresh by preventing bacteria and mould from taking hold.

Our Gospel reading this week brings to mind this very practice. Jesus tells His followers that they are to be *the salt of the earth*. We often use this phrase to describe someone who is good-natured, reliable, and kind—someone you can depend on. But could Jesus have meant something even deeper?

In Biblical times, salt wasn't just a preservative; it was also used as a fertiliser, enriching the soil and encouraging growth. Some biblical scholars suggest that this is what Jesus had in mind. He wasn't only calling His disciples to be good and trustworthy but to actively nurture growth, bring transformation, and change the world.

What might that look like for us today? How can we, as followers of Jesus, not only live good lives but also help others flourish?
