Jesus: Human and Divine

It's interesting that often when you read a familiar passage of Scripture each time you read it something hits you in a way that it has not done so before. The short reading from Luke's Gospel (Ch.8: 22 - 25) is one that captures the imagination and lingers in the memory. It is Jesus "Calming the Storm". It is full of superlatives and, to me, full of excitement, but what hit me about it recently is that it helps us understand Jesus as both Human and Divine as much as anywhere else in the Gospels. Here Jesus was in a boat crossing the lake of Galilee with his disciples, some of whom were fishermen and would know the lake well. They would know all about the dangers of sailing on the lake and the sudden squalls that could arise. Yet here they were apparently taken by surprise by a sudden, raging squall and in imminent fear of drowning. Meanwhile, Jesus, a carpenter (not a professional seaman) is asleep, probably enjoying a rest, after a heavy schedule teaching the people, just trusting "the professionals" to take him safely across the lake. He was just a "man". Up to now it is an ordinary story about an ordinary group of men, with their leader, crossing the lake, but suddenly they got into severe difficulties. The disciples, at this point, woke Jesus in panic: "Master, Master we're going to drown!" Amazing! Professional seamen, in a drowning situation, desperately seeking help from a carpenter! However, from past experience they knew that this "ordinary carpenter" was an extraordinary man, who healed the sick, cast out demons and was an authoritative teacher. Then the unimaginable happened. Jesus didn't address the disciples to give them reassurance, rather He addressed creation, rebuking the wind and the raging waters and, wow, creation obeyed Him! "The storm subsided, and all was calm" No wonder the disciples, in fear and amazement, asked one another "Who is this?". The answer can only be the Creator of creation, in other words, God, the One whose word created the sea and whose word the sea obeys.

Hopefully this helps, just a little, to demonstrate to us both the Human and Divine nature of Jesus.
