Hearing, seeing, touching and believing

I don't know about you, but I think the 20th chapter of John's gospel is the most moving of the whole bible. It starts with the empty tomb and then the risen Lord meeting first Mary Magdalene, then the disciples and then Thomas. All of them started out in the very depths of despair – the hopes and dreams that Jesus had stirred in them all seemed destroyed in the cruel and ruthless manner so typical of their Roman conquerors. But God (thank you Catherine) had other, much better ideas. In each case a personal encounter with a completely alive, but significantly different, Jesus transformed his followers' lives. This pattern has continued ever since and will do so until the last day – whatever that may be. What I find so reassuring is that, despite all the teaching of Jesus, Mary, the disciples and Thomas don't really seem to consider that Jesus could be alive – I am sure we can all empathise with them about that. In each encounter it is Jesus who takes the initiative. When he appears to Mary, she assumes, quite naturally, that he is a gardener but when she hears that so familiar voice everything changes. He is different and now so is she. With the disciples, locked away and fearful about their futures, their despair turns to joy when they see (and hear) Jesus in their midst. Jesus is so gentle with poor old Thomas, "I won't believe that until I have seen him myself". Thomas not only sees Jesus but is invited to touch him and feel his wounds – "yes, Thomas, it really is me."

How are we to respond to this? The truth is that God bore suffering and turned it to love and mercy, and powerlessness was glory not shame. What would our world look like if suffering and injustice produced love and forgiveness and not bitterness and hatred, and where power was trivial compared with love and sacrifice? We may not be able to hear, see and touch Jesus but we can believe, like Thomas, that he is our Lord and our God and be blessed.
