Sadly, if money is our goal, as we are often encouraged to believe, it can drive a need that is never satisfied. For however much you amass, there is always more to add to it. Enough is never enough.

So, I remember 1440. It's all I've got. It's all you've got. Even the richest person in the world, only has 1440. Every day, we are gifted 1,440 minutes. It can't be added to, you can't buy more. Whatever your bank balance, in this we are all equal: we all have 1,440 minutes. We might spend time on our money management, but how much time to we take to consider what we are doing with our 1,440 minutes each day? It is a precious, valuable gift.

Perhaps I need to pause and think about how I spend each minute. In what am I Investing my time? As Christians could we spend more time on the things money can't buy? Paul suggests

pursuing 'righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness'. For in doing so we will find a greater gain, and a contentment that money can't buy. This is good news. God does not judge our value by our bank balance. He invites each one of us to receive his limitless love and to spend eternity with him. And if you ever feel you don't matter, just remember two things. First, in God's eyes you are precious—so precious that Jesus gave up his life for you. Second, remember 1440. No one in the world has more than you...
