

Our Readings today, 2 Kings 2. 1-2, 6-14 and Luke 9. 51end, from the Old and New Testament give us a major contrast in attitudes. The Old Testament reading is the wonderful story about the succession from God's prophet Elijah to the prophet Elisha. Earlier in the First book of Kings we are told of Elisha's call (1 Kings 19:19-21). Elisha was ploughing with 12 yoke of oxen (he must have been pretty rich!) when Elijah came and found Elisha and through his cloak over him, which was a symbolic invitation to discipleship. Elisha's response was to be allowed to say goodbye to his father and mother and then he would follow Elijah. What Elisha actually did was to slaughter his oxen and burn the ploughing equipment in order to cook the meat for his "farewell party" before becoming Elijah's servant (burning his bridges if you like!). In our Reading we see the commitment of Elisha to his calling and his devotion to Elijah. Although knowing that the Lord was going to take Elijah from him imminently, Elisha was determined to stay with his master to the very end and desired only that he might continue serve as God's prophet, with even greater enthusiasm than Elijah. In our New Testament Reading several people are invited to follow Jesus, but each puts the invitation off with various excuses. For one the excuse is similar to the request made by Elisha - to say goodbye to his family, but the inference is quite different. Here it just shows a look warm response, whereas with Elisha it was saying a goodbye completely to his former way of life. I wonder if Jesus had Elisha's call in mind when He made reference to ploughing? If we are to be acceptable in our offer of following Jesus, our full concentration has to be given to serving Him otherwise the furrow we plough will be unacceptable. Jesus points out that following Him comes with the understanding that this is no easy and comfortable life but it is a commitment to a new life where there is a task to be performed of great urgency. It is the most important task of all, that of proclaiming the kingdom of God. The exhortation given to all of us is: "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God – this is your true and proper worship" (Romans 12:1).
